



How much will this cost?

Fortunately, NOT MUCH! Being in band costs A LOT LESS than most people think. Sure, it will cost SOME money, but we are able to work out arrangements to make sure everyone who wants to participate can do so.

After an initial payment due in May, the rest of the fees are spread out over the course of several months to help out our band family.

Throughout the year, additional needs such as band shirts, uniform parts (gloves), instrument needs (reeds), can be taken care of through the band boosters or school book store.

As with all band programs, fundraising opportunities are held throughout the year to make sure that all students have the opportunity to participate in all band activities.

We love jazz at GRC, and it is a class! Students are eligible for jazz once they enter 10th grade.



Will being in band affect my child's grades??

YES - research shows that participate in band will affect your child's grades for the better.

On average, students who participate in school music organizations score 63 points higher on verbal and 44 points higher on math on the ACT than students without musical coursework. Also, 70% of the nation's major universities report that participation in a musical organization is a higher consideration than standardized test scores for admission decisions.

In addition, many real world business concepts are explored and taught in band. Leadership, team building, interpersonal relationships, and management skills are a regular part of the band environment. Regular training in these subjects are taught throughout the year.

That depends on YOU. What we've found is that students who usually have high grades continue to get high grades and those with lower marks usually show improvement. WHY? Aside from an intense influx of strong work ethic, you have access to a 100+ member study group.
